Delphi wrestler is Middle School All-American

Braden Atwood of Delphi represented Indiana on the Gold Team at the Middle School National Duals held last weekend in Danville, Ill. The Indiana Gold team was comprised of all the champions from the middle school state tournament held a few weeks ago. This team finished in third place out of the 22 teams.

The Blue Indiana team, comprised of second place finishers, finished in seventh place.

Atwood finished the tournament as an All-American. He went 6-2 over the two-day tournament, with five wins by pin and

one by a 13-2 decision. In his two losses he was defeated in overtime by a 9-1 decision score. He tallied 34 team points out of a possible 48. The Gold Indiana squad's only loss came to the eventual tournament champion, Team Heffernan from Ohio.

In day one, Indiana Gold defeated Illinois Silver, Nebraska, Ohio, Top Dawgs from Illinois and Tennessee, to finish undefeated and win their pool. In day two, the Gold team beat Kansas and then lost to Team Heffernan in the semi-finals. Team Gold took it to Illinois Silver again to place third.

Manning records diving successes in first season at Bucknell

Jeff Manning, a 2005 graduate of Carroll Jr.-Sr. High School, recently completed his first diving season at Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Pa., by competing in the Patriot League Championships held at the Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md.

Manning finished 10th on the one-meter board and 11th on the three-meter board, helping

the Bucknell's men's team to a third place finish. The teams competing with Bucknell were: Army, Navy, American University, Holy Cross, Colgate, Lehigh and Lafayette.

Manning was one of only three men's divers from his team chosen to compete in this event.

During the season, Manning placed third in Bucknell's All-

Time Record Book for both one and three-meter with scores of 253.3 for six dives on one-meter and 229.73 on three-meter. The Bucknell team finished the season ranked 18th in the country on College Swimming.com Division 1 Mid-Major Polls.

Manning was also one of 253 Bucknell University student Athletes to earn dean's list hon-

ors for the fall semester. Students must earn at least a 3.50 grade point average on a 4.0 scale for selection to the dean's list.

At CJSHS, Manning won the diving event at the Lafayette Sectional three years in a row. He won the regional his senior year and participated in the state championship both his junior and senior year.

Asthmatic children get opportunity to attend summer camp

The American Lung Association of Indiana is now accepting applications for Camp SuperKids - a weeklong, overnight camp for children between the ages of 7 and 14 who have moderate to severe asthma. Due to extensive medical

needs, attending summer camp may not be an option for many children who have asthma. However, each year at Camp SuperKids, children living with asthma are given the chance to engage in popular camp activities such as canoeing, swimming, arts, crafts, and hiking while they learn more about asthma, its trig-

gers, and the skills needed to manage it. For many who attend camp, the skills they learn will be useful for the rest of their lives.

Healthcare professionals from throughout Indiana provide 24-hour medical supervision for the camp. They also teach campers techniques for better asthma management.

The American Lung Association of Indiana conducts one camp each summer. The camp is located at Camp Crosley near North Webster in Kosciusko County and will take place June 11-16. The registration deadline for the camp is May 15.

Through the generosity of hundreds of Hoosiers throughout the

state, the American Lung Association of Indiana underwrites approximately 80 percent of the \$1000 per-camper cost of providing the Camp SuperKids program. The registration fee, therefore, is only \$125 per child, plus a \$5 processing fee. The Association also has available "camperships" so that no child is

denied acceptance because of financial need.

Applications for Camp SuperKids can be obtained by contacting the nearest American Lung Association of Indiana office at 1-800 LUNG USA. A medical committee selects campers based on asthma severity and educational needs.
