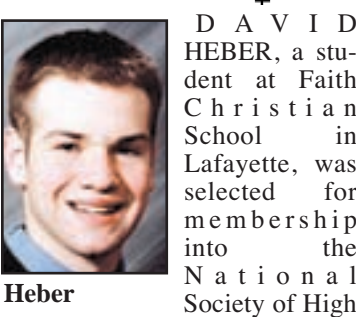


Hillbilly Band

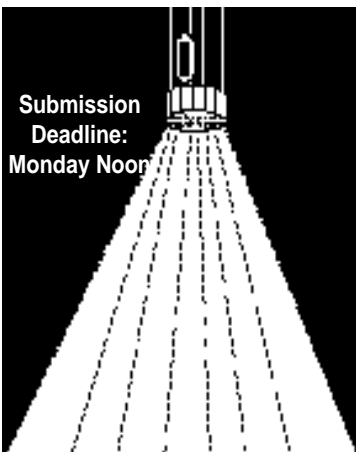
