Trapshooting grand slam

While competing at the Missouri State Shoot in May, trapshooter Wayne Downham shot a score of 100 x 100 from the 27-yard line. This completes his grand slam - every trapshooter's goal.

A grand slam consists of scoring 200 x 200 singles (from the 16-yard line), 100 x 100 doubles (where two targets are released at once), and 100 x 100 from the 27-yard line (the greatest handicap in trapshooting).

Downham has achieved the perfect singles score several times, and got the doubles in Texas last year, but he said for him, the 27-yard score was the hardest of all.

Downham is from rural Camden, and his wife, Mary, is a trapshooter, too. The Comet printed a story about them last January.
