the photographs to Leon C. Sprinkle.

Sprinkle, 48, was charged with child solicitation and five counts of possession of child pornography. Carroll County Sheriff's Deputy

Steve Mullin reported in the Probable Cause Affidavit that he served a search warrant on Sprinkle's residence and found digital media containing sexual acts with children.

Mullin reported that he identified one of the children and interviewed the child. The child reportedly advised that Sprinkle asked the child to take sexually explicit self-photographs. Mullin also found in Sprinkle's possession five pictures showing acts of sexual deviate conduct between adults and children under the age of 12.

The omnibus hearing is set for Aug. 16 at 9 a.m. for both men.
