Caution! This recipe may be addictive. That's the subject line my step-sister, Donna, chose when sending the email that contained this recipe. Toasted Pecan Pudding comes with her highest recommendation. Donna, who lives in Savannah, Tenn., certainly knows her Southern desserts. She recommends placing the ingredients of this recipe in a pretty glass footed bowl. She also suggests using sugar free pudding mix and/or whipped topping to make the recipe at least a little healthier. Happy eating!

- 1/4 C. brown sugar
 - 1 C. pecans
 - 1 C. all purpose flour
 - 2 small boxes vanilla instant pudding
 - 3 C. milk
 - 1 8oz bowl of frozen whipped topping, thawed
 - 1 jar caramel ice cream topping
- Mix first five ingredients and toast at 350 degrees for 30 minutes, stirring occasionally. Mix pudding and milk on low speed for 2 minutes. Refrigerate for 5 minutes, and then fold in whipped topping. Layer half of pudding mixture in bowl then half of pecan mixture. Repeat layers. Drizzle with caramel ice cream topping (if desired) and refrigerate for a few hours to overnight before serving.

Meetings

Wednesday Forum

Members of Wednesday Forum met at the home of Margaret Burkle for their August meeting. The program on "America's 400th Anniversary" was given by Norma Sullivan.

In May, 18 months of events began, called America's 400th Anniversary, and visitors from around the world are invited to see where the nation began.

Near the city of Jamestown, Virginia is Historic Jamestown, site of the original first permanent English colony in the New World. Jamestown is a part of what is called Virginia's Historic Triangle, which also includes Williamsburg and Yorktown. The 23-mile Colonial Parkway links them in convenient and scenic succession.

An Archaearium will feature an exhibit hall and a live archaeology site at the 1607 James Fort. Visitors can view remnants of the settlement including the 1640 Old Church and remains of the 1608 glass factory.

Adjacent to Historic Jamestown, the Jamestown Settlement chronicles the colony's first 100 years. Interpreters depict 17th-century life in re-creations of a colonial fort, a Powhatan Indian Village and the three ships that arrived in 1607: the Discovery, the

Godspeed, and the Susan Constant.

Northeast of Jamestown, Colonial Williamsburg's 301 acres transplant travelers into the past. Yorktown is the site of the last major battle of the American Revolution. All of these sites have special activities and exhibits.

In October of 1957 Jamestown celebrated its 350th anniversary and was visited by the queen of England, Sullivan and her husband Max, who was stationed at nearby Ft. Eustis, Va., participated in this celebration and saw the queen.
