10 YEARS AGO

Talent abounds at Carroll Jr.-Sr. High School and Friday evening much of the talent will be on display at the annual talent show which benefits the Memorial Scholarship Fund. Proceeds fund scholarships awarded to graduating seniors. County employees will soon be paid their wages every other week under a plan approved Monday morning by the Carroll County Commissioners.

25 YEARS AGO
