LOGANSPORT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL is now providing patient encounter data to the Indiana Department of Health's Public Health Emergency Surveillance System (PHESS).

The purpose of this system is to collect Emergency Department data across the state as part of a surveillance system to monitor hospital resources during critical events.

By collecting the primary complaint of the 5300 ER patients seen at Indiana hospitals every day, area trends will be noted by the Indiana Department of Health. When appropriate, this overview agency can alert and organize surrounding hospitals to help during endemic emergencies.

Logansport Memorial is one of 67 Indiana hospitals that are connected through the PHESS system.

ALAN KEMPER of Lafayette was re-elected vice president of the American Soybean Association's (ASA) Executive Committee during the group's summer board of directors meeting held recently in Washington, D.C.
