CARROLL COUNTY ORDINANCE #08-01

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carroll County, Indiana, have the responsibility of and jurisdiction over the construction, maintenance, and repair of certain public highways within the said county which are known and designated as county highways or county roads; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is cognizant of and has been informed by its various agents and employees who are responsible for the construction, maintenance, and repair of said county highways and roads that an Ordinance is needed to regulate those desiring to excavate, cut, trench or otherwise use and/or interfere with the surface, or subsurface, of any highway or street which is a part of the Carroll County Highway System, or the easement adjacent to any such highway; and to establish standards and permitting procedures for such excavations or uses. All proposed excavations or uses, whether for public or private benefit or use, shall be governed by these provisions; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners now finds that it is in the best interest of the said county highways and roads and of the citizens of Carroll County, Indiana, that the authority provided by the State of Indiana under Indiana Code 9-20-1-3 should be exercised.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Carroll County, Indiana:

STANDARDS - PUBLIC OR PRIVATE UTILITY:

A. It shall be unlawful to construct, operate, maintain or install any wire, cables, pipes, conduits, or other equipment for the transmission of electrical current, impulses, sounds, voices, communications, water, oil, or other fluids, in, on, over, across or along any street or highway or the right-of-way thereof, in the County of Carroll without having fully complied with the provisions of this Ordinance.

B. No one shall construct, install, operate or maintain any wires, cables, or other lines of any nature in, on, over, across or along the right-of-way of any street or highway of Carroll County at a height less than 20 feet from the ground or other surface immediately under such wire, cable or line; and, if said wires, cables or other lines carry electric current of 110 volts or more, it shall be unlawful to construct, install, operate or maintain any such wire, cable or line at a height less than 25 feet from the ground or other surface immediately under such wire, cable or line.

PERMIT APPLICATION:

A. No person shall excavate, cut, dig, trench, or otherwise interfere with the surface, or subsurface, of any highway or street which is part of the Carroll County Highway System, or the easement adjacent to any such highway unless such person shall first obtain a permit from the office of the Carroll County Commissioners through the Carroll County Auditor's Office.

B. Form No. C-100, hereto attached, and made a part of this Ordinance, hereby is adopted and approved and shall be used for the application by any person seeking a permit pursuant to Section 1 of this Ordinance to cut into a Carroll County Highway or Street.

C. Form No. C-200, hereto attached, and made a part of this Ordinance hereby adopted and approved and shall be used for the Maintenance Bond by any

person seeking a permit pursuant to this Ordinance.

D. The minimum bond required of any person obtaining a permit pursuant to this Ordinance is \$5,000.00, which bond shall be a continuing one and shall remain in effect for a period of one year from the time the work is completed, which bond is to assure Carroll County the County Specifications have been adhered to and all work done in a workmanlike manner, except that the minimum bond required of private property owners for work performed in the right-of-way adjacent to their own property shall be \$1,000.00.

E. The forms incorporated in this Ordinance are to be used in accordance with all regulations of the Carroll County Highway Department.

PERMIT FEES:

A. Schedule of Fees For Excavations or Other Uses and/or Interferences Within Carroll County Highways:

FEES CHARGED BY CARROLL COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

1. Road Excavations/Cuts:
 Gravel: \$7.50/foot depth/lane* or any part, except farm subsurface drain.
 Minimum: \$50.00
 Hard Surface: \$15.00/foot depth/lane* or any part.
 Minimum: \$100.00
 * 8' - 12' width

2. Paving in Cable: \$30.00, or \$0.05 per Linear Foot (whichever is greater)

3. Trenching/Excavating (adjacent to Roadway):
 Up to 24" width: \$30.00 Minimum
 \$0.25 per Linear Foot

Over 24" width: Charge as an excavation (Minimum Charge of \$30.00)

4. Excavation: Measure Maximum Depth x Maximum Length
 \$0.25 per Square Foot - Minimum Charge of \$30.00

5. Boring or Pushing Under Roadway: (Total Cost per Location) \$25.00 per Bore

6. Pole Lines:
 \$100.00 per mile, or \$0.02 per ft. less than a mile (Construction or reconstruction of 3 adjacent poles, or more.)

7. Driveways:
 Residential \$25.00
 Farm Field \$25.00
 Existing Drive \$20.00
 Commercial Drive \$100.00 Minor Subdivision \$100.00 Major Subdivision \$200.00

Repeater: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Severability: If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any Section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Penalty: Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of a maximum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each violation.
