

Pharmacy burglar arrested, all property is recovered

Will N. Bishop, 31, Flora, has been arrested in connection with the April 18 break-in at Payne's Pharmacy in Flora. He was charged in Carroll Circuit Court with burglary, theft and possession of a con-

trolled substance.

The break-in was reported at 8:12 a.m. by a neighboring business owner. According to Chief Paul Redmon, entry was gained sometime during the night through a door on the south side of the building (Columbia Street).

Bishop was arrested a few hours after the burglary on a warrant out of Howard County. Redmon said a search warrant was obtained and served at his residence where all the property from Payne's

was recovered.

Bishop remains in the Howard County Jail.
