O'Connell for hosting the event at school.

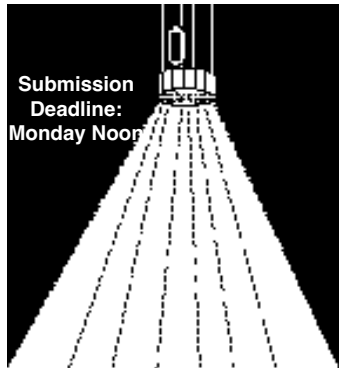
This year's summer reading theme is, "Catch the Reading Bug." Registration begins May 27.
