The National Committee For Childhood Agricultural Injury Prevention estimates more than 100 children die, and another 100,000 are seriously injured annually, in North American farm accidents. Of those injured, 50 percent do not actually live on a farm — a statistic that underscores the need to provide rural safety education for all children living in rural areas.

Delphi FFA is offering local fourth-grade students an educational rural safety program to increase awareness of rural dangers and reduce farm-related accidents. The FFA organization is committed

to bringing the safety program to area kids. "Rural Safety for Kids" is a 128-page instructional book especially written for children who live and often work on the family farm. The easy-to-understand book contains practical information about everything from pesticides to protective equipment and educates children on many aspects of farm safety. It then reinforces the knowledge with fun, effective exercises and activities. The books also serve as a valuable family resource.

Safety Net representative Ron Simons will be visiting local businesses and organizations to obtain support on behalf of Delphi FFA.

You and Your Pet

Dear Dr. Wise: We want to buy a dog that will be both a good pet and watch dog. My husband wants a German shepherd and knows of a litter that soon will be old enough to wean. I worry, however, about the breed's vicious reputation especially since we have children. Do you have recommendations?

Answer: You are worried about what we call dominance aggression. It can be a fairly common problem, but German shepherds can be excellent pets if you select a puppy carefully and put time and energy into its training.

Like other canines, dogs are pack animals. Their human families are their pack. Trouble develops in dogs with dominant personalities who challenge

owners to be pack leader. The problem is most common in cocker spaniels, Lhasa apso, chow chows and occasionally Labradors, Dobermans, Rottweilers ~ and German shepherds. Children and nonassertive owners are most likely to let dogs get the upper hand and behave aggressively.

Neutering males with dominance problems often helps. Problems also can be eased with obedience training that teaches the dog to be subordinate. Lessons can include such submissive tricks as shaking hands, rolling over, and the like.
