### 10 YEARS AGO

The last of the American flags will be mounted this week along Columbia Street in time for Fourth of July festivities in Flora. Over 40 flags will be seen flying from one end of town to the other. Flora Lions Club initiated the project and with the help of town employees have mounted the poles.

Flora Fire Department will be celebrating 90 years of service at an open house on July 4 at the fire station. Early records show that the Volunteer Fire Department was created in 1908.

Phyllis Moore, curator of the Carroll County Historical Museum, will be the grand marshal of Delphi's Fourth of July parade.

The highest temperature for June was 95 degrees. The lowest temperature was 40. There have been five days above 90 degrees. Total rainfall was 7.38 inches for the month.

### 25 YEARS AGO
