and are on file at the Administration Building.

The board amended the minutes from the last meeting to reflect the fact that when the board voted on the administrators' salary schedule, additional information was included in a board handout, and a copy of that handout is now included in the official board file.

In personnel matters, Stacey Brazel resigned as Student Council sponsor, John Filbrun resigned as freshman football coach, and Jacklyn Williams was granted a leave of absence. Williams will take a maternity leave for the 2008-2009 school year.

Zook announced that proposed amendments have been made to the following policies by the corporation's web
