ducers share the same values as many Hoosiers. They are committed to their farms, their families and the future of their livelihood," said Acting Indiana Agriculture Director Ken Klemme. "We also want the public to explore our Web site and see how modern livestock farmers operate their farms and care for their animals. We think this program will be an excellent way for farmers and their non-farming neighbors to learn more about each other."

Four Certified Livestock Producers were recognized as a part of the program's launch. David Hardin, hog farmer from Danville; Joe Kelsay, dairy farmer from Whiteland; Clark Sennett, beef producer from Waynetown and Jim Zimmerman, poultry producer from Redkey received their Certified Livestock Producer Program farm signs. They were part of the nearly 40 farmers who participated in the pilot group, most of who are being certified in the coming weeks.

"We want to encourage as many livestock farmers as possible to participate in the program. For those livestock farmers who participate, we will offer local training sessions to make this program accessible to livestock farmers across the state," said Klemme.

Indiana livestock producers can apply to the program by submitting an application form to ISDA. Farmers can submit the application prior

to or on the day of their local Certified Livestock Producer training session. The application and the training session schedule can be found online at www.in.gov/isda.
