The Cougars finished off a long week of four games in five days with a tournament at Danville High School. Carroll defeated Danville on Saturday in a sudden death shootout behind goalie Abdon and some great penalty kicks. The Cougars played Danville in the consolation game of the tournament after losing to Mooresville in the first round.

The Cougars got on the board first against Danville

with a goal off the foot of Ch. Meade that sailed over the goalie's head. Kiel Lester assisted Meade on the goal. The Cougars kept a 1-0 lead into the second half until Danville scored on two goals within about a two-minute period. Trailing 2-1 the Cougars got a great lead pass from Co. Meade to his brother who got his second goal of the game, knotting the score at two. Neither team could put one in the net and the score at the end of regulation was 2-2. That put the game on the penalty kick line and the Cougars came through. Both teams converted on their first 6 penalty kicks with neither goalie having a chance. With each team missing their 7th kick and Abdon making a save for the Cougars and the Cougars' penalty kick sailing high, that left the game up to the eighth kickers for each team. Abdon came up big again, making a diving save that brought Ch. Meade up for the game winning penalty kick that he stuck in the back of the net.

Abdon ended with 4 saves for the Cougars, who now have an overall record of 6-1. The win over Danville was Carroll's only second win in 8 games at the Danville Tournament.

The Cougars' next home game is next Tuesday at 5 p.m. at the high school field.

The Cougar defense held the Trojans to just 67 yards rushing - a team effort.

The tackling was spread out with several players in on the action - Brandon Williamson, Jonathan Bush, Riley Eller, Thomas Gillam, Josh Pine, Drake Harper and others.

Offensively the Cougars lit up the scoreboard. Eller was 4-7 for 128 yards. Yoder caught 2 passes for 90 yards and Zook 1 for 27 yards and Spesard 1 for 16 yards. Bagwell had 153 yards rushing, Bennington 83.

The ISLC is a diverse, multi-type resource sharing network composed of 30 member libraries including an art museum, the Indiana

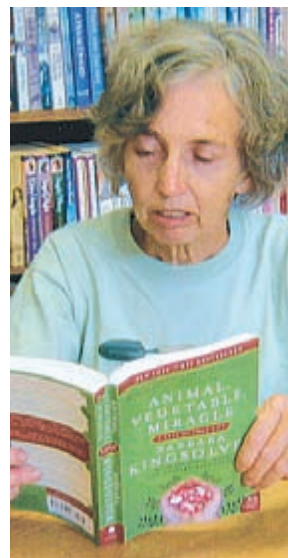
