

TAF announces grant recipients

Recipients of grants from the Tippecanoe Arts Federation and the Indiana Arts Commission will be recognized at this year's Bravo Breakfast for the Arts. These grants are awarded

annually through a competitive process administered by the Tippecanoe Arts Federation throughout the Region IV 14 counties. Grants serve as an incentive for the strengthening and develop-

ment of communities to plan and implement quality arts activities. The Tippecanoe Arts Federation is awarding \$145,715 to 32 organizations in Region IV. The Bravo Breakfast for

the Arts will take place at 7:30 a.m. on Oct. 7, at the University Plaza Hotel in West Lafayette. Along with the grant recipients, guests will include local and state legislators and officials from the Indiana Arts Commission, as well as representatives of local organizations and individuals involved in regional arts interests.

The recipients are from nine counties of Region IV. Carroll County recipients include Book Readers and Horn Blowers, Psi Iota Xi-Beta Alpha Chapter (Flora), Delphi Public Library, and Flora-Monroe Township Public Library.

Activities of the Tippecanoe Arts Federation are provided, in part, with support from the Indiana Arts Commission, a state agency, with funds from the Indiana General Assembly and the National Endowment for the Arts.

After Church Crockpot Casserole

- 1 pkg. beef stew meat, approx. 1 lb.
 - 2 to 3 medium potatoes
 - 2 to 3 carrots
 - 1/2 onion
 - Shredded cabbage if desired
 - Salt and pepper to taste
 - 1 tsp. garlic salt
 - 1 can tomato soup
- Place all ingredients in slow cooker on high while you go to church or bake approximately 1 1/2 hours at 350 degrees.

Taco Casserole

- 1 1/2 lbs ground beef, browned
- 1 15 oz. can kidney beans
- 1 15 oz. can Ro-Tel tomatoes
- 1 package taco seasoning
- 2 cups frozen corn
- 2 cups grated Cheddar/Monterey Jack mix cheese
- 2 large handfuls tortilla chips,

crushed
Mix all ingredients together and pour into 9" x 9" casserole dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes covered. Uncover and bake another 10 minutes or until browned. Garnish with avocado, lettuce, tomato, green onions and sour cream.

Spicy Ranch Chicken Casserole

- 1/4 cup margarine (or butter)
- 1 med. green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 med. onion, chopped
- 1 can (10-3/4 oz.) condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can (10-3/4 oz.) condensed cream of chicken soup
- 1 can (10 oz.) Extra Hot or Milder Ro-Tel
- 2 cups cubed cooked chicken
- 12 corn tortillas, torn into bite-sized pieces
- 2 cups (8 oz) shredded cheddar cheese

In a large saucepan, cook pepper and onion in melted margarine, until tender (about 5 min.). Add soup (s), Ro-Tel and chicken, stirring until well-blended. In a 13x9x2-inch baking pan, alternately layer tortillas, soup mixture and then cheese, repeating for 3 layers, ending with cheese. Bake 40 min. or until hot and bubbling.
