

Rossville is Four Star School

Comet staff report

Superintendent of Public Instruction Suellen Reed announces that 177 Hoosier public schools have been honored with Four Star School awards for the 2006-2007 school year.

The award is the highest state distinction and is based on student achievement on ISTEP+ assessments and overall attendance rates.

Among the schools being recognized is Rossville Elementary School. Seventy-seven percent of Rossville students taking the ISTEPs passed both the math and English/language arts portions. The school recorded a 97 percent attendance rate.

"We are proud of these schools for their exceptionally high performance," said Reed. "We are pleased to have the opportunity to recognize so many Indiana schools for their achievements and encourage

all schools to continue striving for this accomplishment."

A total of 1,811 Indiana public schools were eligible for the Four Star School Award. To earn the distinction, a school must be accredited by the Indiana State Board of Education, meet Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) as defined by The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB), and perform in the top 25 percent of all the schools in the state in each of the following four areas: student attendance rates, mathematics proficiency scores, English/language arts proficiency scores, and the percent of students passing both English/language arts and mathematics. The annual award is non-monetary and schools earning this honor receive an award certificate.

Leading Carroll with 17 points and 6 rebounds was A. Spesard. Craig added 11 points and 8 rebounds. Carroll shot 17 of 49 (35%) from the field and 9 of 15 (60%) from the line, while Taylor was 23 of 49 (47%) from the field

CARROLL COUNTY ORDINANCE #08-01

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carroll County, Indiana, have the responsibility of and jurisdiction over the construction, maintenance, and repair of certain public highways within the said county which are known and designated as county highways or county roads; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is cognizant of and has been informed by its various agents and employees who are responsible for the construction, maintenance, and repair of said county highways and roads that an Ordinance is needed to regulate those desiring to excavate, cut, trench or otherwise use and/or interfere with the surface, or subsurface, of any highway or street which is a part of the Carroll County Highway System, or the easement adjacent to any such highway; and to establish standards and permitting procedures for such excavations or uses. All proposed excavations or uses, whether for public or private benefit or use, shall be governed by these provisions; and WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners now finds that it is in the best interest of the said county highways and roads and of the citizens of Carroll County, Indiana, that the authority provided by the State of Indiana under Indiana Code 9-20-1-3 should be exercised.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Carroll County, Indiana:

STANDARDS - PUBLIC OR PRIVATE UTILITY:

A. It shall be unlawful to construct, operate, maintain or install any wire, cables, pipes, conduits, or other equipment for the transmission of electrical current, impulses, sounds, voices, communications, water, oil, or other fluids, in, on, over, across or along any street or highway or the right-of-way therefore, in the County of Carroll without having fully complied with the provisions of this Ordinance.

B. No one shall construct, install, operate or maintain any wires, cables, or other lines of any nature in, on, over, across or along the right-of-way of any street or highway of Carroll County at a height less than 20 feet from the ground or other surface immediately under such wire, cable or line, or if said wires, cables or other lines carry electric current of 110 volts or more, it shall be unlawful to construct, install, operate or maintain any such wire, cable or line at a height less than 25 feet from the ground or other surface immediately under such wire, cable or line.

PERMIT APPLICATION:

A. No person shall excavate, cut, dig, trench, or otherwise interfere with the surface, or subsurface, of any highway or street which is part of the Carroll County Highway System, or the easement adjacent to any such highway unless such person shall first obtain a permit from the office of the Carroll County Commissioners through the Carroll County Auditor's Office.

B. Form No. C-100, hereto attached, and made a part of this Ordinance, hereby is adopted and approved and shall be used for the application by any person seeking a permit pursuant to Section 1 of this Ordinance to cut into a Carroll County Highway or Street.

C. Form No. C-200, hereto attached, and made a part of this Ordinance hereby adopted and approved and shall be used for the Maintenance Bond by any person seeking a permit pursuant to this Ordinance.

D. The minimum bond required of any person obtaining a permit pursuant to this Ordinance is \$5,000.00, which bond shall be a continuing one and shall remain in effect for a period of one year from the time the work is completed, which bond is to assure Carroll County the County Specifications have been adhered to and all work done in a workmanlike manner, except that the minimum bond required of private property owners for work performed in the right-of-way adjacent to their own property shall be \$1,000.00.

E. The forms incorporated in this Ordinance are to be used in accordance with all regulations of the Carroll County Highway Department.

Severability: If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any Section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Penalty: Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of a maximum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each violation.

Vs. Frontier

With Coach Hodson serving his suspension, assistant Tom Allen and JV Coach Nick Beaver shared coaching duties for the Frontier game.

The Frontier game was almost a carbon copy of the Clinton Central game. Neither team could gain control throughout the contest. In the first quarter there were three ties and five lead changes before Carroll was able to hold a 16-14 advantage after one.

Carroll opened up a 7-point lead early in the second on a basket by A. Spesard and Eller trey for a 21-14 lead with 6:05 left in the quarter. After a timeout, Frontier stormed back with a 12 to 0 run to go up by 5 at 26-21. They held a one point lead at the half, 28-27.

After two ties in the third, a trey by Ives gave Carroll the lead back at 36-34 with 4:08 left. The Cougars held that advantage after three quarters, 42-40. The fourth quarter proved to be more of the same. The Falcons took a 58-57 lead late in the game with 1:30 left. Another trey by Ives had Carroll up for good. Two free throws by C. Spesard with 4 seconds left secured the win.

Craig led Carroll in scoring with 20 points and 7 rebounds. Ives was 4 of 8 from behind the arch and 17 points. C. Spesard

had 7 points and 5 boards, while Jason Hazel had 6 points and handed out 6 assists. The Cougars were 21 of 47 (45%) from the field and almost gave the game away at the foul line, hitting 13 of 23 (57%).

The Cougars will finish regular season on the road with a chance to earn a share of the Hoosier Heartland Conference title. Their opponent will be 4th ranked, Class A Lafayette Central Catholic (14-5, 4-0) on Friday. CC leads the series 22-6.

Two wins for the JV

Carroll's Junior Varsity (13-6) got a pair of easy wins over the weekend — at Taylor, 38-24, and against Frontier, 50-37.

The Cougars trailed Taylor 6-4 after one, but took over in the second period. They outscored Taylor 34 to 18 in the final three quarters.

Jordan Brumbaugh led Carroll in scoring with 8 points. Drake Harper and Noah Allen added 6 points each.

Saturday, Carroll never trailed Frontier. They jumped out to a 14-3 advantage after one, increased that lead to 17 points by half-time, 28-11, and by the end of three were up by 22, 42-20.

The Cougars had good balance in scoring with Kyle Geheb leading the way with 13 points. Dallas Butcher, Riley Johnson and Brumbaugh each added 8 points.
