worked for Kevin Ross managing a nursery-to-finish hog barn.

John has been accepted into Ivy Tech where he plans to major in animal science, with a goal of working in the swine industry. He has started a small swine herd, producing show pigs. His goal is to sell pigs to people who show pigs across the country at national shows. He would also like to have a small herd of beef cattle in the future. He plans to help his dad on the farm part-time during planting and harvest.

John is involved in FFA and has participated in soils judging and livestock judging. He ranked first in the district and second in the state in beef production proficiency. A 10-year 4-H member, John achieved grand champion gilt in 2003, and the Swine Achievement Award and the Charley Award, both in 2008.

Natalie Garrison and Kristine Barnard, the 2008 scholarship winners, received their scholarships this year (from the former Carroll County Pork Producers).
