

County youth receive scholarships

Several students from Carroll County will be receiving help with the cost of going to college this fall through scholarships awarded by the Carroll County Community Foundation. The Foundation has awarded approximately \$254,000 in scholarships for the 2009-2010 school year, including the two Lilly Endowment Community Scholarships.

The recipients of these scholarships were recognized at a reception held recently at the Wabash & Erie Canal Interpretive Center in Delphi.

"There were so many deserving high school graduates this spring," says board member Alan Jackson, of the Carroll County Community Foundation. "These scholarship recipients are the students whose teachers and peers admire them for the achievements they have made and the goals they have set for their futures. Obtaining a post-secondary education is not an easy task. Through these awards, we hope to alleviate some of the pressure and allow them to focus on the most important part of college - higher learning."
