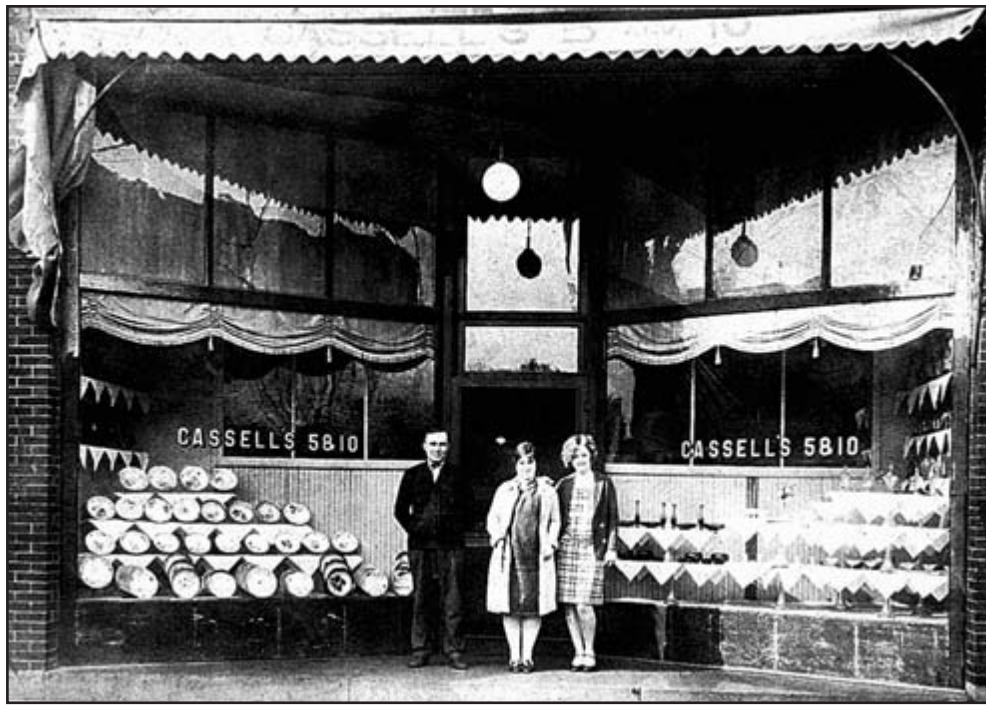


Looking Back

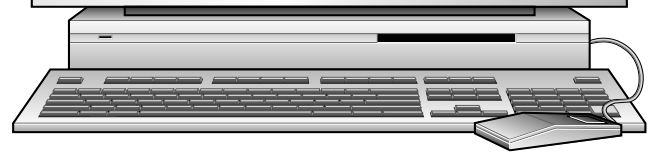

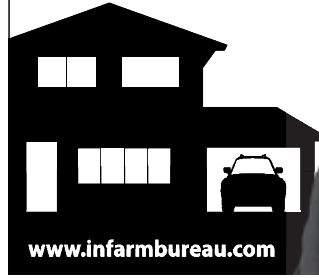
